## PIPE ORGAN IN ST TUDY CHURCH

Magazine readers will remember that at this time last year the possibility of re-building the existing old and out-dated pipe organ in the Church was canvassed. At that time, it was made clear that the first priority had to be the generation of the funds needed to repair the church roof, and that the cost of rebuilding the organ for £22,000 would have to await until the £50,000 has been secured.

Following the extraordinary success of the roof appeal committee in obtaining the funds needed, the Parochial Church Council has invited me to investigate the prospects of securing the amount needed to complete the rebuild. There are a number of charities to whom application will be made for financial support but all expect the locality to commit itself to finding a significant part of the overall cost. It is very encouraging therefore, that I have been promised a contribution of £5,000 if the residue can be found from other sources including of course, from within the village of St Tudy and the immediate neighbourhood. I am well aware that many residents have contributed generously to the Church Roof Appeal, but I would welcome offers of help from any source, whether they be conditional or not, to raise sums, large or small, so that I can report back to the PCC at the end of the summer on the result of my investigations. The St Tudy Parish Council met on Wednesday 29th June in the Village Hall. The new County Councillor Clr D Rowe also attended. Clr Chris Selby sent his apologies. Four members of the public attended.

- A planning application for the refurbishment and part conversion of a coach house/gardeners cottage at Lamellon was examined and no objections were raised. •A planning application for the construction of twelve boarding kennels at Wetherham Heights was examined. Concern centred on barking noise from the kennels. After having sought professional advice, the applicants told the Council that the kennels would be sited with the brow of the hill between kennels and the village. No objections were raised.
  - The Council raised no objections to a planning application for the construction of a new sewerage plant at Hengar Manor.
  - The Council examined a summary of the PC accounts for the past year for onward transmission to the auditors.
  - A Parish Plan discussion was put back for the July Parish Council meeting. It will be necessary to consider the feasibility of managing a plan for St Tudy.
- Villagers are always welcome to attend Parish Council meetings.

## **ST MABYN PARISH COUNCIL**

The Council met on 5th July. The following business was discussed:

- One planning application was considered; to erect a dwelling and garage on a site at the edge of the village. The Council objected to this application and the Clerk was instructed to notify NCDC accordingly.
- It was reported that NCDC has agreed to site one bin for dog waste within the village. The siting of the bin was left to the discretion of NCDC with a recommendation that it be sited in Wadebridge Road.
- The annual accounts were approved as drafted.
- The Clerk reported on the progress being made towards filling the two vacancies on the Council. One will be filled following an election which is likely to take place on 15th September and the other by co-option at the next Council meeting on 6th August.
- The current state of the recreation field was again discussed. It was agreed that the Council will arrange for the grass to be cut at least once a week between March and September weather permitting. This will improve the growth and reduce the problem of grass cuttings.
- It was also agreed to support an application for grant funding to improve the facilities on the recreation field for junior football,
- It was agreed to arrange for the infilling and tarmacing of the site of the old canteen next to the Village Hall (land owned by the Parish Council) and at the entrance to the recreation field in Wadebridge Road. The work is due to be undertaken during the week commencing 11th July.

- The current state of the footpaths was discussed. At this time of year, the footpaths can become seriously overgrown. A report was received on the work being done to improve the access to footpaths in particular at stiles and crossing points in hedges and over walls. The necessary clearance work is proceeding satisfactorily.
- Other matters included routine correspondence, routine maintenance of the Parish Council's land and property and the approval of the monthly accounts.

The next meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 6th August at 7.30pm. All parishioners are most welcome to attend. Anyone wishing to fill the current vacancy through the co-option process is invited to put their names forward either to the Parish Clerk or to any Councillor by Friday 29th July next. Applicants are then invited to attend the next meeting when the first item on the agenda will be the filling of the vacancy by co-option. The applicants will be invited to introduce themselves to the Councillors, who will then elect the new Councillor. If therefore anyone is interested in serving on the Parish Council, please made every effort to find out more before putting your name forward and coming along to the next meeting.
