The Council and District Councillor, Colin Mutton, met on the field north of Joey's Meadow on 23rd June to consider a planning application for a new C of E Primary School to be sited there. The site itself seemed ideal with open views to the south west. The chief concern is that school traffic density on the Bodinnick Road could be a problem. Other concerns stated included the maintenance problems of wall cladding, the appearance of the metal roof and the proximity of a soakaway to Jory's Meadow. The meeting continued in the Village Hall.

A planning application for the conversion of a bungalow to a house at Pen Breta, Hengar Lane was supported by the Council. Apart from urgent business, the next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Wednesday 24th September. All villagers are welcome to attend.

ST MABYN PARISH COUNCIL

Notes from the agreed Minutes of the Meeting of St Mabyn Parish Council Tuesday, 3rd June. 7 Cllrs attended the meeting. Mrs Charlotte Bany was co-opted on to the Parish Council. Cllr K Brown was elected as Vice Chairman for the forthcoming year.

Chapel Field, St Mabyn: The Chairman made some enquiries, following reports of human waste being spread onto the land at Chapel field. These proved to be erroneous.

Planning Applications / Planning Matters: The Walled garden, Tredethy, Hellandbridge – Erection of 11 No holiday cottages. No Objections / Support and repeat previous comments for this site, as returned with Application No. 2008/00074, that the Parish Council considered the height of the wall should be further reduced and the new proposed entrance was too close to the main road junction. Goosey Cottage, Becoven Farm, St Mabyn – Installation of two sets of solar water heating panels together with installation of a twin stainless steel flue for pellet fired room heater / water heater. No Objections / Support. Planning Decisions received from North Cornwall District Council: 2008/00513 Mr & Mrs P Wilson, Little Trevisquite, – Alteration and extension – Approved. 2008/00536 Mr & Mrs Flynn, Trelinden, Rectory Lane – Erection of extension –Approved.

Site Meeting for 2008/00183 Midas Homes Limited, land between Chapel Lane and Chestnut Drive, St Mabyn – Erection of 35 dwellings. Councillors who attended the site meeting reported on issues raised. The main concern was the entrance to the proposed site and the intention of Midas to reduce the width of the existing carriageway in this area of the village, and the removal of the hedgerow and trees.

CCC Local Maintenance Project 2008/2009: Matters relating to the footpath from the lay-by at Longstone to Menkee were reported. A handrail has been suggested.

Parish Seats: The refurbishment of the seat at Highgates had been completed. The seat at Greenwix had been cleaned and was to be re-coated. The concrete base had also been cleared of moss etc. The seat in the Burial Ground requires cleaning.

A resident on Wadebridge Road continues to report damage to their hedge by farm vehicles - an ongoing problem each year.

St Mabyn Parish Council welcomes Mr Ian Kemp on to the Council. The next Council Meeting will take place Tues 2nd September 7.30p.m in the Village Hall.
