It is going to be a busy year as the Roof Appeal is launched in St Tudy and the Friends of St Mabyn continue their fundraising. The St Tudy Church Fete will be held on Saturday 14th May. We are trying a change of date, hoping that the weather will be kinder to us and so that we do not clash with the many events that seem to happen in June. I do hope that this change of date will not cause any problems.

ST TUDY PARISH COUNCIL

The Council met on Wednesday 24th November. Cllr Colin Mutton, the District Councillor also attended.

- There was support for and there were no objections to the planning application for a toilet for the disabled and a new kitchen at the St Tudy Methodist Chapel.
- There were no objections to an application to the re-siting of a garage.
- The Council agreed to a revision in the hours worked by the Parish Clerk and also an increment of one point on the salary scale.
- Councillors Mrs Shelley, Mrs Kingdon and M L Shelley had attended a training day on low cost housing, organised by North Cornwall District Council and chaired by Cllr Mutton. Low cost housing may be built where there is a recognised local demand by the community and, outside the existing planning boundaries and where finance is available. At present only about a third of the demand can be met.

- Cllr Selby asked if the area around the War Memorial could be tidied, say with troughs of flowers at the same time as the granite kerbstones are installed. There was discussion also whether car parking should be allowed adjacent to the Chestnut tree. There was a feeling that car parking was a difficult problem in the village centre and should be allowed. In the meanwhile, the Clerk would find out about Parish Council insurance liability on parish land in the village centre.
- The Parish Council take this opportunity to wish everyone in St Tudy a merry Christmas and a peaceful New Year.
- The public is always welcome to attend Parish Council meetings, the next being held on Wednesday 25th January at 7pm in the Village Hall.
