ST MABYN PARISH COUNCIL

The Council met on 3rd May. The following business was discussed:

- Both the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman were unanimously re-elected for the coming year.
- Three planning applications were considered, one to upgrade a derelict barn and two to extend existing properties within the village. All applications were approved subject to one abstention and two objections.
- It was agreed to set up a sub-committee consisting of three parishioners to consider the future use of the recreation field and to make recommendations to the Parish Council as to how best the recreation field can be utilised for the benefit of the parish as a whole and how any proposed changes can be funded. The sub-committee consisting of Caroline Osborne, Shirley Finnemore and Helen Barratt will begin work straight away and will report to the Parish Council from time to time. All suggestions and offers of help will be most welcome.
- It was agreed to instruct contractors to re-tarmac the entrance to the recreation field in Wadebridge Road; the costs of which will be borne by the Parish Council.
- It was with regret that the Parish Council received news of the resignation of Councillor Laura Jones. Mrs Jones has been a valuable contributor to Council meetings but feels that due to outside pressures she is unable to continue. Council recorded its thanks to Mrs Jones and instructed the Clerk to initiate the process to advertise the vacancy that now exists on the Council.
- It was agreed to carry out routine maintenance to the old canteen site adjacent to the Memorial Hall.
- Other matters included routine correspondence, routine maintenance of the Parish Council's land and property and the approval of accounts.

ST MABYN PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on 7th June. The following business was discussed:

- One planning application was considered, to remove a redundant wall in a listed building. The application was unanimously approved.
- There was a long discussion on the formation of the sub-committee to consider the future use of the recreation field. The sub-committee's terms of reference were approved by the Council and the sub-committee was authorised to begin consultations and enquiries with a view to making recommendations to the Council at future meetings. There was also a discussion involving parishioners who attended, concerning the management of Council business generally and the publication of both dates for future meetings and reports on past meetings. The Council noted the points made and responded accordingly.
- The current condition of both the recreation field and local footpaths was discussed in detail. It was agreed that, at this time of year, both the field and the footpaths need more regular attention and concern was expressed particularly over the current state of the footpaths and the manner in which the Council maintains them. The Chairman was instructed to obtain further information on these issues and to report back at the next meeting.
- It was with regret that the Parish Council received the news of the resignation of Councillor Mark Menhenitt. Mr Menhenitt has been a valuable and fully committed member of the Council, but now feels unable to continue. With the resignation of Mrs Jones, there are now two vacancies on the Council. The Clerk will take immediate action to fill these vacancies either by an election or, in due course, by co-option. Anyone interested in putting their names forward to fill these vacancies should contact the Clerk, the Chairman or any existing member of the Council.
- Reports were received on the current state of the maintenance work to be undertaken by the Council including tarmac paving the entrance to the recreation field from Wadebridge Road and infilling the potholes on the site of the old canteen adjacent to the Memorial Hall. Instructions were given to expedite this work in as far as is possible at this time of year.
- Other matters included routine correspondence, routine maintenance of the Parish Council's land and property and the approval of accounts.

The next meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 5th July at 7.30pm. All parishioners are most welcome to attend.

I have always been told that after buying clothes for the daughter my parents hoped would succeed their son, my mother was leaving the Piccadilly entrance of Swan & Edgar's store when a Zeppelin dropped (by modern standards) a small bomb in the Circus. This hurried matters on.

After being taken back to her small flat, my father, hopeful of a quiet leave from the war in France, was hurriedly dispatched with the perambulator to fetch extra coal from the Chelsea tip. (The horses normally dragging the coal wagon round were in France dragging guns and the gas supply was intermittent.) Nurse Craufurd, the midwife, telephones being a rarity, was summoned by telegram.

So equally inconveniently any 90th birthday falls on a Monday (18th July). My daughter from America is joining her sisters here that weekend. On the following Saturday 23rd July, Pamela, who has somehow stood me for fifty nine years, and I, would like to offer refreshment, between 11am and 3pm, to the many who have shown us so much kindness over the last quarter of a century, while we have been privileged to live in St Tudy.

St Tudy has adopted the civilised custom on such occasions for a charitable collection instead of presents. Some years ago, the village supported the building of the Heartswell Hostel at Derriford and several from here have used it. So successful has that facility been, that funds are being sought to double the rooms available.

But, Heartswell apart, it is just your presence that would really give us the greatest pleasure.

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 25th May at 7pm in the Village Hall. District Councillor Colin Mutton attended. Cllr Nick Fletcher sent his apologies. No members of the public attended.

The meeting started with the Parish Council AGM and the following were elected: Chairman Cllr Brian Lamerton, Vice Chairman Cllr Chris Selby. In attendance were Cllr Margaret Ham, Cllr Kim Kempthorne, Cllr Mavis Kingdon, Cllr Lee Madden, Cllr Jonathan March, Cllr Margaret Shelley, Cllr Mev Shelley.

The regular monthly meeting followed. One planning application for an industrial type building in Wetherham Lane was discussed. The Council recommended that the appearance should be in keeping with the area.

Information about Parish Plans, provided by the NCDC, was distributed. Councillors undertook to be prepared to discuss this subject at the next Parish Council meeting in June. It was necessary to consider the feasibility of managing a plan for St Tudy. So far, two members of the public had shown interest in forming a Parish Plan Committee.
