On the first Whit Sunday (Pentecost) in Jerusalem, when the disciples felt the power of the Holy Spirit come upon them, they were no longer afraid to "witness" to Jesus as they went out into the streets of Jerusalem to tell the crowds who were gathered there, about Jesus. As Christians this is our mission in life also. We are helped in this task because we believe that God the Holy Spirit is always present with us to help, strengthen and comfort us at all times.
