ST MABYN CAR PARK

At the public meeting held in July, it was agreed that insufficient information was, at that time, available to enable parishioners to make an informed decision on the proposal to site a car park in the Glebe Field behind the Village Hall. Parishioners asked the Parish Council to obtain estimates of the costs to be borne by the Parish Council under the terms of the proposed agreement with the Glebe Estate. Those estimates are now available and will be circulated shortly.

There will be further public meeting in the Village Hall at 7.30pm on Tuesday 16th November. The purpose of the meeting is to enable this fresh information to be discussed and for parishioners to express their views as to whether there should be a car park in the village and, if so, where it should be sited. The Parish Council hopes that the meeting will produce a general consensus on this issue to enable a final decision to be made at the Parish Council meeting in December.

If, therefore, you have a view to express or are interested generally in contributing to the decision making process, please make every effort to attend. If you cannot, then please respond to the letter that you should receive within the next two to three weeks. If you do not receive this letter, please contact the Chairman for additional copies.

BINDING STONE COMMITTEE

ST TUDY PARISH COUNCIL

The St Tudy Parish Council met on Wednesday 29th September. Two members of the public were present. Cllr David Miller, the County Councillor attended. Apologies were received from three Parish Councillors.

There were no planning applications to consider.

Cllr Miller said that the County Council had no budget this year for the provision of a signpost at the top of Head Hill, The Parish Council asked Cllr J March to make a new signpost based on the former one,

No one had applied to look after the public toilets. Cllr- B Lamerton, who is doing the work at present, offered to continue and declared his interest. The Council voted that he should receive the same sum quarterly as the previous caretaker.

Cllr Lamerton had said that 43 granite kerbstones would be needed to finish the area near the chestnut tree. He will look for a reasonable source of kerbstones and a decision will be made next meeting, granite or concrete.

The Council thought that shrubs should be planted in the area occupied by the fir tree and paid from the Jubilee fund.

Cllr Miller explained that there are new Government rulings for the Standards Board. Councillors were invited to a presentation of the latest requirements of the Standards Board.

There was a request for a warning sign on the bend near Tremeer Lane. Cllr Mev Shelley asked for the Council at its next meeting on 27th October to list all hazards in the village due to traffic.

ST MABYN PARISH COUNCIL

The St Mabyn Parish Council met on 5th October. The following business was discussed:

Two planning applications were considered, one to refurbish and extend a redundant barn, another to build a nursery at the Village School. The Council itself made no objection to either application.

Estimates have now been received in relation to some of the costs to be incurred in the construction of the car park. Estimates in respect of the costs of the building work necessary are still awaited. It was resolved to arrange a Public Meeting in the Village Hall

on Tuesday 16th November at 7,30pm to enable parishioners to consider the information obtained and express their views on the car park generally so that this issue can be finally resolved at the Council meeting in December. Separate notification will be sent out to parishioners in the form of a letter to be circulated prior to the meeting.

The Council was unable to give further consideration to a proposal to develop a cycle track in the Recreation Ground, as there was no attendance by supporters and no fresh information to consider. The matter was therefore adjourned to the next meeting.

The Council received a report on the refurbishment of the play equipment in the Recreation Ground. The work necessary has been completed and the play equipment now accords with the required standards.

The refurbishment of the Church clock has been completed and it is now keeping excellent tune, The Council has entered into an annual maintenance contract with the Company responsible for the refurbishment. Some parishioners have already made donations to these costs. The Council expressed its gratitude.

It was resolved to approach NCDC concerning the availability of Dog Waste Bins. In other parishes, NCDC has supplied and serviced bins for this purpose. The position will be reviewed again at next month's meeting.

A report was received on the current condition of the Recreation Ground generally and the problem of the possible dumping of garden waste on Council land. It was resolved to deal with this problem direct with those responsible,

Other matters included routine correspondence, the state of the footpaths and approval of accounts.

The next meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 2nd November at 7.30pm. All parishioners are most welcome to attend.
