WALK AROUND ST TUDY

As part of an initiative organised by NCDC's Coast and Countryside Service and supported by St Tudy Parish Council, Doug and Anne Reed will again this year lead a circular walk around the village on the first Thursday of August and September. The walk will start from the Chestnut tree at I lam and will be about 3 miles of easy walking lasting about one and a half hours.

BROADBAND (ADSL)

Do you have a computer and use the Internet? Do you wait for an age for each page to download? Would you like to be able to make and receive phone calls when you are using the internet? Would you like to have all your updates downloaded quickly and **NOT** wait for them to install? Would you like to send and receive large e-mails (photos) without a long up/downloading time? Do you want to pay for only one BT line? **Yes!!** Then you need broadband; St Tudy must have broadband.

BT will only broadband us "If demand at any exchange without a preset trigger level (St Tudy all, 841, 850, 851 numbers) is significant (about 200). BT will assess whether an appropriate trigger level (about 100 to 200) can then be set."

At this time only 68 people have registered their interest in broadband. If you have not registered with BT then please do by going to

www.bt.com/btbroadband/register/ns_register_intro.jsp (it's FREE) or go to the St Tudy web site at www.sttudy.org.uk/introduction.htm and click on the link to BT Broadband registration. Let's get the 200 people registered.

When 200 people have registered we can put pressure on BT for this magic trigger, then broadband!!!
