The Parish Council met on 25th July in the Village Hall. Two councillors were not present. The Chairman welcomed Mrs Judith Jasper who had been co-opted as a member.

There were two planning applications, both of which received the support of the Council:

- St Tudy Playing Field Trust – coppicing of trees to the south of the Playing Fields covered by a tree preservation order.
- Lamellon Estates – conversion of Kelly Green Mill to a single family dwelling.

The accounts of the Parish Council for the year ending 31st March 2007 had been audited. The auditor's observation that bank balances were high was noted. The Council accordingly will consider any extra projects that can benefit the village in next year's budget.

All villagers are welcome to attend Parish Council meetings.

We have often been asked what work needs to be done, as not much is visible from a quick look and so Richard Jenkin has put together a display, in the church, of photographs, taken mainly by our architect, of the parts of the roof which are not easily visible, and show clearly what needs to be done. Many thanks to him. Do take a look when you are nett in the village. The huge cost arises from the size of the building, and its ancient listed state, requiring craftsmen and lots of scaffolding. Warmest thanks also to Pauline Kent, Phil Tizzard, Roger Nicholls and Roy Dinshaw for a truly lovely concert of Classical Favourites. Those of you who missed it will have another opportunity as they are performing the same programme on 8 September in St Thomas Church, Camelford. The audience came from a wide area - including two ladies from Falmouth who had read about it in Inside Cornwall and declared themselves delighted. We look forward to the final concert in the Summer Music programme on 22 September with the Wadebridge Male Voice Choir. We are saying our prayers that the monies will have been raised by the end of the year and so are planning our End of Appeal celebration! Bishop Bill, our Patron retired at Easter and we all want to thank him for his support and so we are holding a party, in the church on Friday 29 February. Everyone is warmly invited to attend. Planning Applications / Planning Matters: 2007/01004 Mr R Parkhouse, Land adjacent to Corfe House, St Mabyn – The erection of a new three bedroom detached dwelling. The Parish Council have objected to this application and continue to confer with NCDC Planning Office re land ownership and access to the site. 2007/01136 Mr AR Driscoll & Mr P Harrison, Churchtown, St Mabyn – Conversion of existing single family dwelling back to the original separate units together with erection of a single storey extension to rear of properties. The Parish Council objected to this Application

Playing Field. A quote to trim the trees overhanging Station Road. by Mr C Willett was accepted. The wood if suitable, will be chipped and placed in the areas below the play equipment. The parking lines to the main entrance gates will be repainted. The Clerk will arrange for the new entrance signs to be fixed once the painting of the gates was complete. The Council resolved not to enforce the new "No Smoking" ban in the playing field (the new Government legislation which came into effect on 1st July 2007).

School Transport – location of bus stop at Longstone / Longstone, Bus Shelter: This matter is still unresolved.

Community Punishment Agency Work: Labour work would be carried out at no cost to the Parish Council. The Chairman agreed to work with the Agency and complete the necessary paperwork. CCC Local Maintenance Project 2007/2008: A public rights of way at Longstone required further trimming work. Fence / Wall on land adjacent to Public Toilet and St Mabyn Memorial Hall: A quote is being sought to build up the section of the wall concerned. Should there be a delay, Cur G Saundry will arrange for this work to be done.

NCDC – Results of the NCDC Poll, following the County Councils proposal for a Unitary Authority; of the 39.9% returned, 82.2% did not support the CCC bid. Parking Area – St Mabyn: That behind the bus shelter is not the responsibility of NCDC.

Date of next Meeting: Sept 4th at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. Parishioners are invited to attend and to bring up any concerns they may have, at the Open Session at the beginning of the Meeting.
